## Dubai World Cup draw: Brass Hat to try for brass ring

Fred Bradley is a no-nonsense guy who, if nothing else, is going to tell you how it is at every turn.

"Six months ago, I never could have imagined I'd be halfway around the world in Dubai with my family getting ready to run a horse in a \$6-million race," the 73-year-old owner and breeder of Donn Handicap (G1) winner Brass Hat said on Wednesday in the moments leading up to the post-position draw for the \$6-million Dubai World Cup (UAE-G1).

"I've been in this business for 40 years and I've done everything there is to do. I've bred horses. I've trained them. I've broken them. I've raced them. I've foaled more than I care to remember ... but to be a part of something like this is just too much to fathom, honestly."

Brass Hat, who is trained by Bradley's son, Buff, drew post seven in the 11-horse field, which includes multiple Group 1 winner Electrocutonist and multiple stakes winner Kane Hekili as well as United States-based Grade 1 winner Wilko and Grade 2 winners Super Frolic, Magna Graduate, and Choctaw Nation.

Godolphin Racing's Electrocutonist, winner of last year's Juddmonte International Stakes (Eng-G1) at York and the 4-to-5 morning-line favorite by at least one British bookmaker, drew the rail for the 2,000-meter (9.94-furlong) race at Nad al Sheba racecourse.

"I would have preferred to be to the outside, but we weren't lucky today," Godolphin trainer Saeed bin Suroor said of the five-year-old son of Red Ransom, who scored a seven-length romp in the Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid al Maktoum Challenge Cup-Round 3 (UAE-G2) on March 2 over the Nad al Sheba dirt. "Maybe our luck will come with a good trip on Saturday."

Kane Hekili, winner of the 2005 Japan Cup Dirt and, most recently, the February Stakes on February 19 in Tokyo, drew post three, just to the inside of Choctaw Nation, a hard-charging closer who showed his affinity for Nad al Sheba's never-ending stretch with a third-place finish in last year's World Cup.

"If we get a good pace, he's going to have a chance," California-based trainer Jeff Mullins said of the six-year-old Louis Quatorze gelding, who will race for the first time under the colors of Sheikh Rashid bin Mohammed al Maktoum. "He's more fit than he was last year, and with him, there's really no strategy. He's going to be at the back and come charging hard at the end."

Brass Hat, who has thrust the Bradley family into the world spotlight, likely will do the same.

"He's come from far back every time, so I don't think you're going to see him on the lead," said Bradley, a Vietnam veteran, former lawyer, and Kentucky state senator who has owned his 320-acre farm in Frankfort, Kentucky, since 1967. "If we get a hot pace, we're going to make things interesting in that stretch run."

## Corinthian sidelined with hairline fracture in hind leg

Corinthian, who finished first in the Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) and was disqualified to third for causing interference in the stretch, will miss the Triple Crown after the detection of a hairline fracture in his left hind leg.

"He has a hairline fracture on the top and front of his pastern bone," said Pat Lamberty, spokesman for owner Centennial Farms. "The injury is fairly minor and he will not have surgery. He's not even going to the farm; he's going to stay in [trainer] Jimmy Jerkens's barn at Belmont [Park]."

### Aqueduct

Grade 2-placed stakes winner **Fifth Avenue** (Monarchos) is among eight three-year-olds fillies entered for Friday's \$60,000 **Wayward Lass Stakes**, a one-mile test on the main track. Stakes winners Daytime Promise (Five Star Day) and Pure Disco (Disco Rico) are also slated to contest the Wayward Lass.

### Evangeline Downs

Grade 3 winners **Culinary** (El Amante) and **Ballroom Deputy** (Silver Deputy) are among seven older fillies and mares entered in Friday's \$75,000 **Goddess Stakes**, a one-mile race on the main track.

Precocious Kat (Precocity), who carries a four-race winning streak into the race, was tabbed the 9-to-5 morning-line favorite for the Goddess. Stakes winner Thunderdoll (Thunder Gulch) is the 2-to-1 second choice on the morning line

### Gulfstream Park

**Rehoboth** (Wagon Limit), a stakes-placed winner trained by Frank Gomez, prepped for an expected start in the \$1-million **Florida Derby (G1)** on April 1 by breezing six furlongs in 1:16 on Wednesday at Calder Race Course.

"He just went a nice, easy three-quarters," Gomez said. "He's ready to go."

Rehoboth exits a fifth-place finish in the Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) on March 4.

**Fairbanks** (Giant's Causeway), the \$1.85-million sale topper at the 2004 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale of selected yearlings, will make his racing debut on Friday against nine rivals in a 1 $\frac{1}{16}$ -mile maiden special weight race for three-year-olds on the turf at the Hallandale, Florida, oval.

Trained by Todd Pletcher, the bay colt is a half brother to Grade 2 winner Keats (Hennessy). Fairbanks is out of Alaska Queen (Time for

### Santa Anita Park

Jockey **Jose Valdivia** resumed riding on Wednesday, six days after having a kidney stone surgically removed.

"I'm feeling great," Valdivia, 31, said. "I'm just glad that the episode is done and over with. It was very painful. I don't wish it on anybody, but it happened and I'm glad it's over now."

**Patrick Valenzuela**, who leads the rider standings at the Arcadia, California, track, was excused from his mounts on Wednesday because of neck pain.

Trainer **Dan Hendricks** plans to work **Brother Derek** (Benchmark) six furlongs this weekend. The workout will be the first for the Triple Crown hopeful since he breezed four furlongs in :49.40 on Monday.

"He came out of his half-mile work real good," Hendricks said. "It took so little out of him, I took him right back to the track the next day. Everything's right on schedule."

### Turfway Park

An opportunity to run on Polytrack was a big factor in trainer Mark Casse's decision to point **Seaside Retreat** (King Cugat) toward the \$500,000 **Lane's End Stakes (G2)** on Saturday.

"They say horses that like grass seem to do well over Polytrack," Casse said. "My horse ran once on grass and won."

Seaside Retreat outran Bear's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) by a half-length to win his turf debut on September 1. Bear's Kid won the Summer Stakes (Can-G2) in his next start.

# Hollendorfer's trio tops Golden Gate Fields Handicap field

Three horses trained by Jerry Hollendorfer will face three rivals in the \$150,000 Golden Gate Fields Handicap (G3), a 1½-mile turf race for older horses on Saturday.

## ACE BLUE

Hollendorfer's trio includes graded stakes winners Ace Blue (Brz) and Adreamisborn and stakes-placed winner Symphony Sid. The stablemates will face a field that also includes Grade 2-placed stakes winner Capitano and stakes-placed winners Cosmonaut and Cheroot.

Adreamisborn—winner of the 2005 Bay Meadows Breeder's Cup (G3) and Stanford Breeders' Cup (G3) Handicaps—exits a win in the San Quentin Stakes on March 4, a race in which Symphony Sid was third. Ace Blue—winner of the '05 Mervyn Leroy Handicap (G2)—finished third in the All American Handicap (G3) on February 20 in his seasonal debut. The son of Coax Me Clyde was outrun by runner-up Adreamisborn during a fourth-place finish in the Holiday Turf Handicap on December 26.

Thomas Bell trains Capitano, the winner of the Turf Paradise Hand-

icap on February 11. The son of Belong to Me earned his first stakes win last year in the Rolling Green Breeders' Cup Handicap at Golden Gate and earned consecutive runner-up finishes in the 2003 Best Pal (G2) and Norfolk (G2) Stakes.

# Records galore set at OBSC March juvenile sale

Agent Buzz Chace, acting for new buyer Al Gold, set a new all-time record price for any Ocala Breeders' Sale Co. sale, bidding \$1.8-million for a colt by *Belong to Me* at the OBSC March sale of selected two-year-olds in training.

Chace outlasted Jimmy Gladwell, representing Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Darley Stable, for the big, handsome bay who worked a quarter mile in :21 at the first presale breeze show on March 11.

"I thought he'd bring a lot of money," Chace said. "Horses that work like that, they usually go on. He was the fastest work in the sale, and he just has a great demeanor. It's a lot of money, but I think he's a lot of horse."

Gold is a New Jersey real estate developer new to the Thoroughbred business, and will send the horse to trainer Todd Pletcher. Bred in Kentucky by Mike Akers, Jeff Bowen, and Randy Zeller, the colt is the first foal out of winner Vassar, by Royal Academy, and was listed as reserve not attained on a final bid of \$105,000 at the 2005 Keeneland September yearling sale.

"If this is what \$1.8-million feels like, I'd hate to feel \$16-million," said consignor Ciaran Dunne of Wavertree Stable. "We felt like he was the best horse in the sale and we figured five, six, maybe \$700,000. He's a grand horse, he's got leg, and he's a beautifully balanced horse."

### SALE TOPPER

The sale surpassed the previous OBSC high of \$1,725,000 for the broodmare *K.D. Princess*, dam of 1982 Horse of the Year *Conquistador Cielo*, set in 1982.

About ten minutes later, Gladwell set another OBSC record, bidding \$1-million for a sweet-moving filly by *Indian Charlie* out of *V Sign*, by *Robellino*, easily beating the previous record of \$575,000 for a filly set by *Yankee Victress* in 2004.

"John [Ferguson] usually is not keen on buying fillies at two-year-old sales," Gladwell said, "but we thought she was pretty special."

Consigned by Mike and Britt Mulligan's *Leprechaun Racing*, the filly worked a quarter in :21.20 at the first presale breeze show on March 11. *Leprechaun Racing* purchased the filly for \$67,000 at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky sale of selected yearlings.

The seven-figure horses assured that the sale as a whole would climb into record territory as well. For the two days, 286 horses sold for a record \$31,044,000, up 17.6%, setting a record average of \$108,545, up 32.8%. Median also rose to a record \$75,000. Buy-back rate remained stable at 27.4%.

"We knew that we had some more of the horses that really showed well on the track and were nice physicals that fell today," said Tom Ventura, OBSC's director of sales. "That's just the way the alphabet fell."

"Once you get to a certain price, I don't think you can predict what these horses will bring."

"I think this sale has been moving right along and maybe today we arrived in the big time."—*John P. Sparkman*

## Pinhooker Dunne applauds 'team effort'

Ciaran Dunne has been pinhooking horses for a long time. The Irish-born horseman came to America to work at Margaux Stud in Kentucky in 1987, and spent some time on the racetrack with trainers Tom Skiffington, Niall O'Callaghan, and Graham Motion.

But all too soon, in Dunne's words, "Kentucky got cold."

The Bluegrass state's colder winters precipitated a move to Florida and by 1994 Dunne was out on his own, pinhooking two-year-olds. He has had his share of successes, selling Grade 3 winners *Gone Fishin* and *Your Tent Or Mine*.

The record \$1.8-million juvenile Dunne sold at the 2006 OBSC March sale of selected two-year-olds in training, though, is easily his biggest, surpassing a \$1.5-million *Golden Missile* colt sold at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale of selected two-year-olds in training in 2005.

"It's a team effort," Dunne emphasized after the sale. "I've been gone since January 24. I go to Miami and I go to California, and I show up here and all the work is done for me."

Dunne credits his wife, Amy, and assistants, Mark Edmonds, Sal Ruivera, and John Howard.

"They're the guys that make it happen," he said.

In recent years he has benefited from a partnership with Mike Akers of *Dapple Bloodstock*. Akers and Dunne buy yearlings to resell and also sell *Dapple Bloodstock* (which includes partner Randy Zeller) homebreds like the record *Belong to Me* colt.

Akers consigned the colt to the 2005 Keeneland September yearling sale but knew he would not sell when the colt was placed toward the end of the sale.

"He was a great physical then, as he is now," Akers said, "but we felt there was some upside, and we got lucky."

*Dapple* bought the colt back for \$105,000 and sent him to Dunne. "It was a risk, but it was an acceptable risk," Akers said.

Pinhooking is a high risk/high reward business. This time the risk paid off.—*John P. Sparkman*

“This has been a great sale for West Point. We purchased a nice Two Punch from Ciaran Dunne, a lovely Lear Fan filly from Norm Casse and several colts in the \$70,000 to \$90,000 range that we feel are very legitimate horses. We also purchased a few nice New York-breds, which are easy to syndicate, so we are well along in terms of our acquisitions for this year. You really have to do it here in March, it's a pivotal market and the better educated you are as a buyer, the better you will do.”

“I think everybody felt that the better horses were on the second day, and the million-dollar horses really helped the momentum of the sale. We had [nine] through here today and sold all [nine]. Yesterday, we brought three up here and sold one through the ring.”

## Turf course at Nad al Sheba 'looks like pool table,' McLaughlin says

Even under Dubai's morning haze, the turf on the Nad al Sheba course is a bright green.

The lush grass is even and yields gently while still holding together.

The turf's resiliency owes not only to the fact that the rail has been out on it throughout the Dubai International Racing Carnival, which began January 11, but also to not having a race run over it for a week.

Two Group 1 races, each offering a \$5-million purse, are set for the turf course during the Dubai World Cup (UAE-G1) meeting on Saturday—the Dubai Sheema Classic and Dubai Duty Free.

### McLAUGHLIN

"I can't get over how good that turf looks," said trainer Kieran McLaughlin, who will saddle two-time Grade 3 winner Mustanfar for the 2,400-meter (11.93-furlong) Dubai Sheema Classic.

McLaughlin, who was visiting Dubai for the first time in three years, scurried across the track and walked around on the soft, inviting lawn, then returned to the rail with a huge smile.

"It's hard to understand how difficult it is to get a good turf course in the desert, everything they have to do to it," he said. "This is so good. It looks like a pool table."

The dirt track also feels a little deeper and softer than last year.

"They have added water to the track. It feels great," said trainer Jeff Mullins, who returned with two third-place finishers from last year—Grade 1 winner Captain Squire, who is entered for the \$2-million Dubai Golden Shaheen (UAE-G1), and Grade 2 winner Choctaw Nation, who will start in the \$6-million Dubai World Cup.

"It gets more like Churchill [Downs] all the time," McLaughlin added as he bent down and grabbed a handful of the dirt.

McLaughlin will also send out Uruguayan standout Invasor (Arg) in the \$2-million United Arab Emirates Derby (UAE-G2).

He is able to take in the real thing—as well as the rest of the rich sights and sounds of Dubai—as he is in the Middle Eastern country for the first time as the exercise rider for Grade 2 winner Magna Graduate, who will start in the \$6-million Dubai World Cup (UAE-G1).

Cordero is also the agent for Eclipse Award-winning rider John Velazquez, who will pilot Magna Graduate in Saturday's race. Velazquez rides first call for Todd Pletcher and Cordero exercises horses for the trainer in the mornings, including Elisabeth Alexander's four-year-old

son of Honor Grades, thus gaining a valuable perspective for Velazquez, whose career he has helped to shape.

"It's beautiful here," Cordero said of Dubai. "I am very impressed. "It's like a dream," he continued. "I've never seen stuff like this before. The hotels are like palaces, and everybody is so helpful."

Magna Graduate finished the 2005 season with consecutive victories in the Pegasus Stakes (G3) on September 30 at the Meadowlands, Discovery Handicap (G3) on October 29 at Belmont Park, and Clark Handicap (G2) on November 25 at Churchill Downs.

He opened 2006 with a fourth-place finish to fellow Dubai World Cup participant Brass Hat in the Donn Handicap (G1) on February 4 at Gulfstream Park.

Despite Magna Graduate's disappointing finish in his seasonal bow, Cordero said the colt has been training well leading up to the most lucrative start of his career.

And only one thing could make Cordero's trip to Dubai more memorable than it already has been.

"I just hope we win. That would make it even nicer."—Steve Bailey

### Jockey McEvoy aims to kick off year in a big way ... again

The number two rider for Godolphin Racing behind Frankie Dettori, McEvoy pulled one of the biggest upsets—in arguably the evening's most impressive performance—when he rode Blues and Royals to a 12-length romp in the United Arab Emirates Derby (UAE-G2), besting undefeated Group 1-winning stablemate Shamardal.

"It was quite exciting and as much a surprise to me as it was everyone else," McEvoy said early Wednesday morning during a large media

day gathering at Godolphin's Al Quoz training facility.

"Everyone already had seen what Shamardal could do, and there were high expectations for him," he said. "My horse was not as exposed as most of the others but showed exactly how good he was when he blew the rest of them away. That was very special.

"It also sort of let a lot of people know I could ride as a lot of people in England and other places around the world took notice of the victory," said McEvoy, who was based in Australia before signing on as Godolphin's second-call jockey in 2004. He guided Brew to victory in the 2000 Melbourne Cup (Aus-G1).

"It was the beginning of a great year for me," he said of Blues and Royals unexpected win.

McEvoy has several chances to get his 2006 season started off in similarly successful fashion on Saturday as he will ride Blatant in the Godolphin Mile (UAE-G2), Unification in the UAE Derby, Heart Alone in the Dubai Golden Shaheen (UAE-G1), Layman in the Dubai Sheema Classic (UAE-G1), and Perfect Promise in the Dubai Duty Free (UAE-G1).

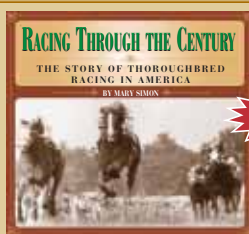

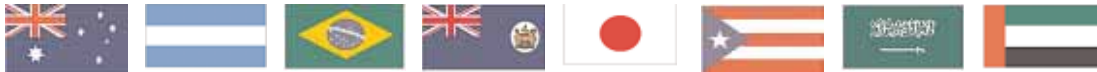
